

No two days at Hoedspruit Reptile Centre are the same therefore your schedule will be changeable and flexible as events and structure will vary from week to week based on bookings. Nevertheless, every student will experience at the very least the following during their time at the Centre:

- The normal day to day routine at the Centre
- An excursion into the wilderness to see reptiles in the wild
- Any courses/tours/programmes booked during the duration of their stay
- Preventative medicine and medical care for animals that require it at the Centre
- A community outing
- Developing an enrichment protocol for a reptile species at the Centre and implementing it
- Presenting a short lecture about reptiles to the staff and your colleagues at the Centre
- Various lectures on reptile husbandry, physiology and behaviour will be given throughout their stay

Whenever possible students will be allowed to attend reptile rescues and relocations as well as management of rehabilitation cases.

A rough schedule would be as follows:

Day 1

Welcome/Settle In

- Arrive at your new home at the Centre, where you will be given a brief introduction, shown around the house and allowed to settle in.
- Once you have unpacked, grabbed some lunch and relaxed, you will be given a basic orientation of the workings at the Centre, meet all involved and get to know your way around. Basic rules and regulations will be discussed, and a brief tour of the facility given.
- You will learn what Hoedspruit Reptile Centre stands for and what our missions are.

Day 2

Daily Duties

Help with duties in and around the Centre:

- Daily assessment, cleaning and maintaining of enclosures.
- Upgrading of enclosures.
- Administration duties such as maintaining animal records.
- Health and wellness checks of all animals.
- Food preparation and feeding of animals.
- Medical work with sick or hurt animals.
- Animal enrichment.
- Attend any courses/programmes/lectures being given at the Centre.

Day 3

Daily Duties

The aim is to assist us in teaching people about reptiles and learning from people's attitude towards reptiles. Community outings can occur at local schools, hospitals, orphanages or with general public.

Day 6

Rest Day

Time for some much needed, well deserved rest. You can relax around the pool, go for a hike on a nature trail, visit one of the tourism attractions or do some shopping in town, the choice is yours.

Day 7
